



New Leadership of NJ Airports and SWF

The Aviation Department is pleased to share the following appointments to key leadership positions:

Sarah McKeon has taken on the role of General Manager of NJ Airports, replacing James Gill, who has resigned from agency. In this role, Sarah will provide strategic leadership and oversight of Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR) and Teterboro Airport (TEB). Sarah's Port Authority career spans over 18 years.

Most recently, Sarah was named Deputy Director of Aviation Planning and Development. Sarah has held progressively responsible leadership positions at EWR, including Facility Maintenance Specialist, Assistant Manager of Airport Maintenance, Manager of Airport Maintenance, Physical Plant Manager, and over three years as Deputy General Manager. Prior to joining Aviation, Sarah also

held roles in the Engineering and Procurement Departments.

Omar Astacio has been named General Manager, New York Stewart International Airport (SWF). Omar has served in this role in an interim capacity since February 2020 and has been with the Stewart Airport team from day one, serving as the agency's first Resident Engineer at SWF following the PA's acquisition of the airport in November 2007. He subsequently advanced into other managerial roles including Manager of Airport Facility Projects and Manager of Airport Operations and Security.

Omar joined the Port Authority as an Intern in 1990 at the GWB, followed by rotations as an Engineering trainee. After the 1993 WTC bombing, Omar was part of Engineering's WTC Construction staff before moving to EWR in 1994, then to roles of increasing responsibility at JFK and the GWB.

During her tenure, Carrol continued to advance the important work of the Workplace Equity Council, which has taken on the follow ups to the initiatives of the Leadership Steering Committee. Additionally, Carrol has led the team in building capacity and increasing minority- and womenowned business enterprise (MWBE)

utilization within all categories of Port Authority contracting activities.

Jose Febrillet has now taken the role of Chief Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Officer. Jose will continue to drive the agency's relentless focus on promoting diversity, equity and inclusion with both internal and external stakeholders. As a 34-year agency veteran, Jose has a broad background and has worked with virtually every department in the agency.
