PAPD Welcomes its Most Diverse Graduating Class Ever

The Port Authority Police Department has just welcomed 151 new officers into its ranks following the graduation of the 121st police academy class last week.

The new class is the most diverse in the PAPD's history, fully representing the rich diversity of the region that the PA serves. Among them are 30 women — the highest number of female recruits in a PAPD class; as well as 130 college graduates; 20 military veterans; 84 with prior law enforcement experience; and

Since launching in September 2022, the Aspiring Business Managers Program (ABMP) has helped to further the careers of our agency's administrative professionals, providing them with the critical skills and tools needed to succeed.

On Tuesday, August 8, a celebratory breakfast was held at 4 WTC to reunite the program's first three cohorts. More than 70 graduates and instructors gathered to share success stories and to highlight how the program has helped to transform the careers of several participants, which include 25 new Business Managers.

The 3-month program, developed together with the Administrative Professionals Networking Group, covered a range of topics including supervising, interviewing,

A pair of Media Relations interns recently hosted the first Innovation Hub (iHub) Media Showcase at 4 WTC. Fronted by Media Relations interns Stella Pagkas and Carlos Rene Lozano, the event highlighted the Innovation team's ideas that developed into real-world pilots.

"We wanted to give the employees who have worked really hard on these iHub pilots the opportunity to speak directly with reporters because they know their projects best," said Stella.

The August 9 showcase included six pilot projects with the employees responsible for each idea at their tables with videos playing and poster boards with information and photos.

"I'm extremely proud of what we have been able to put together in these last 18 months and it's all because people have stepped up with new ideas, project management, and

for road safety.

The Lincoln and Holland Tunnel catwalk robot high school challenge is the iHub's first challenge and was submitted by the iHub team's own **Ann Jenica Jose**, Innovation Intern. While the initial idea was proposed by the General Manager of the Lincoln Tunnel, it was Ann Jenica's idea to involve high school students. She said it was "surreal" to have her idea implemented.

Agency Sponsors STEM Summer Program at Kean University

During a Kean University summer program sponsored by the Port Authority and Kean's Office of Career Services, pre-college students from Jersey City and Elizabeth explored potential careers in engineering, cybersecurity and other STEM-related fields.

"We support the regional and local economy," said Jenny Davis. Chief of intergovernmental Affairs at the PA. "The Port Authority needs to get people engaged and interested in what we do. What better way to start than with students."





The Full STEaM Ahead pilot program brought 25 middle and high school students to Kean's main campus for four weeks of classes, experiments, and field trips designed to build their skills in STEM areas and ignite their interest in future career paths.

The students, selected with the help of community partners, Team Walker in Jersey City and the Elizabeth Development Company in Elizabeth, went to Newark Liberty International Airport, Liberty Science Center and the Skylands campus in Jefferson Township and were mentored by Kean students.

"I learned that math is needed for everything," said Mena Mansour, 15, of Jersey City, a high school junior, who said she wants to become a doctor. "This program made me sure of what I want to do."
