PA Redevelopment Projects Bring Together Hundreds of Local, Diverse Firms

The agency's redevelopment of transportation infrastructure across the region continues, with two upcoming projects at **Newark Liberty International** Airport and at the Port of New York and New Jersey drawing interest from hundreds of local businesses.

The Port Department, Office of Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion (ODEI), GOCOR, and the Procurement Department recently hosted a speed networking event for contractors interested in working on the Port Wharf Rehabilitation Program.

Watch: TAPP Comes to WTC PATH

The PA has expanded the Total Access PATH Payment (TAPP) system to the five terminal stations in the PATH system, allowing passengers to pay their fares at select turnstiles with the tap of a contactless debit/credit card, smartphone, or wearable device. The rollout of TAPP continued this week with the installation of 12 TAPP turnstiles at the World Trade Center, the system's busiest station.

TAPP is now available at select turnstiles at several PATH stations, including WTC, 33rd Street, Newark-Penn Station, Journal

Square, Hoboken, and Harrison. These six stations are the system's busiest, accounting for 67 percent of total ridership in 2023. The TAPP rollout will move to the system's remaining stations in New Jersey and New York over the coming months.

PATH has recorded more than one million TAPPs since the system's launch in December, indicating a quick and seamless adoption by riders. On an average weekday, nearly 20,000 TAPPs are recorded among passengers entering the PATH system.

LGA Named Best Airport in its Class

LaGuardia Airport has soared from worst in class to best in class, according to airline passengers surveyed by a leading airport rating agency. The top marks, which were released on March 11, came from passengers who reviewed the airport for overall satisfaction for the highly regarded Airport Service Quality (ASQ) survey in 2023, which was the first full year that all new passenger facilities at LaGuardia were completed and in use.

More than 4,200 passengers participated in the survey at LaGuardia, which was conducted near the airport's gates throughout 2023. ASQ surveys asked passengers to rate all aspects of the passenger journey

THON is the largest student-run philanthropy program in the world, holding an annual 46-hour dance marathon. Altogether, it has raised more than \$16.9 million this year to benefit Four Diamonds Children's Hospital in its efforts to conquer childhood cancer.




